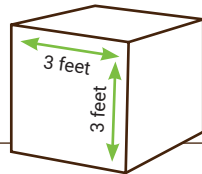

5 gallons or less \$2

Food scraps \$1 for less than 5 gallons, \$2.50 per 5 gallons
Propane & helium tanks 75¢ for 1 lb, \$3 for 20-30 lb
Maple tubing by volume, call ahead
Smoke detector \$5
Tires residential \$5 or \$6 on rim, commercial \$6 or \$7 on rim
Batteries, TVs, Computers, House Paint and Stain, CFLs, Fluorescent Bulbs and Mercury Devices
no charge for residents

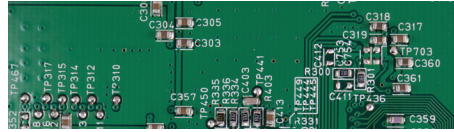

- **Batteries** (small household, lead acid, etc.)
- Fire extinguishers
- **Fluorescent bulbs & CFLs**
- Hand & power tools
- Maple tubing (by appointment)*
- **Mercury thermostats & thermometers**
- **Paints & stains** (no spray/automotive/industrial)
- Propane and helium tanks*
- Rechargeable tool batteries
- Scrap metal under 4 feet
- Smoke* & CO detectors
- Tires (auto & small truck only)*



OFFICE & TECH



- CDs, DVDs, floppy discs
- Cell phone cases
- **Computers, TVs** & accessories
- Desktop printers
- Documents for shredding
- E-Waste, electronics, radios
- Ink & toner cartridges
- Phones (cell, office, home)
- Tablets, media players, e-readers
- Video games, consoles & remotes
- Vinyl records
- Wires, cables, & adapters

HOUSEHOLD ITEMS

- Books (hard & soft cover only)
- Cigarette waste (no cartons)

PACKAGING



- Baby food squeeze pouches
- Beer bottle caps
- Bread bag tags
- Brita filters & packaging
- Burts Bees packaging
- Cereal bags (unprinted only)
- Chip, cracker, & popcorn bags
- Contact lenses & packaging
- Corks
- Cough & cold medicine bottles (over the counter only)
- Dental floss containers
- Drink pouches
- Energy bar wrappers
- Household cleaner packaging (spray triggers, pumps, lids, etc)
- Packing peanuts (bagged)
- Pellet stove bags (must be cut open and clean)
- Pet food bags (Wellness, Open Farm, Royal Canin & Earthborn brands only)
- Plastic lids & caps 2" and under
- Plastic packing materials (bubble wrap & air pillows)
- Prescription, vitamin, and supplement bottles & lids
- Toothpaste tubes

SPORTS GEAR & CLOTHING



- Bike tires & tubes (no slime)
- Clothing, linens & luggage (clean, reusable)
- Eyeglasses & sunglasses
- Shoes
- Skis/boards/boots/poles
- Sports equipment (no helmets or pads)
- Tennis balls
