

What is Hazardous Waste?

Hazardous waste is any product that has environmental and human health risks associated with its use and/or disposal. A hazardous product contains ingredients that pose a safety or health hazard by being ignitable, corrosive, reactive or toxic.

Hazardous wastes must be disposed of at a hazardous waste collection or facility!

Examples of Common Hazardous Wastes

HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTS:

Products containing bleach (tub, tile & toilet cleaner, laundry soap, toilet bowl)
Drain openers, oven cleaners, floor wax
Oil-based paint, paint thinner
Solvents, tar, adhesives
Pesticides, aerosols, moth balls

AUTOMOTIVE PRODUCTS:

Gasoline, kerosene, contaminated oil
Transmission fluid, brake fluid
