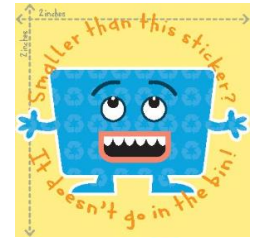

Boxboard, like cereal & frozen dinner boxes

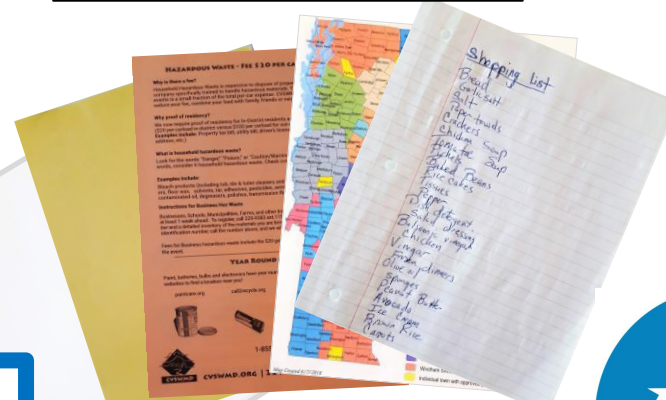

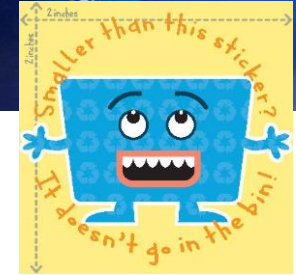
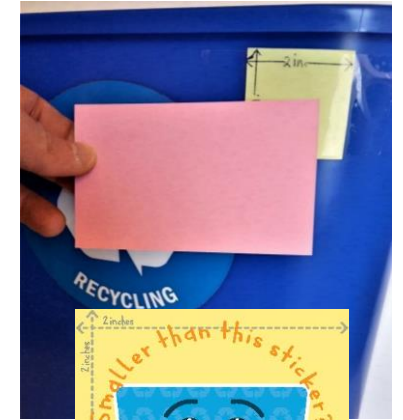
Pizza boxes, including with grease stains

All banned from the landfill in VT!

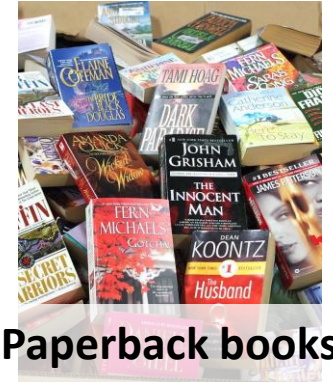
Must be clean & dry!

Blue Bin Glass Recycling:



Glass bottles and Jars



Banned from the landfill in VT!

Must be Clean!

This is basically what blue bin recycling for glass is about for Vermonters!

Note: Glass bottles & jars collected for recycling in VT will be used to make fiberglass insulation or will be ground into glass aggregate & used in road construction.



Blue Bin Recycling for Cans, Metal Lids, & Aluminum Foil:

All are banned from the landfill in VT!

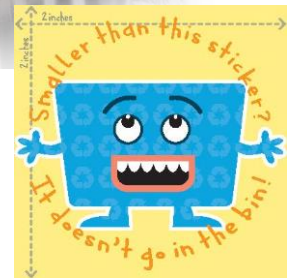
Must be Clean!

Aluminum Foil, Pie Plates, & Baking Pans



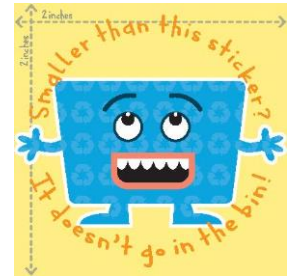
This is basically what blue bin recycling for metal is about for Vermonters!

Note: All these metal materials can be recycled indefinitely, providing significant environmental benefit.



Blue Bin Recyclable Plastics:

Rigid plastic, single-use containers for: 



- ❖ Ketchup and mustard
- ❖ Yogurt
- ❖ Peanut butter
- ❖ Mouthwash
- ❖ Shampoo
- ❖ Water, juice, soda, and milk
- ❖ Laundry and Dish Detergent
- ❖ Clear tubs for berries and salad greens
- ❖ Lids over 2 inches
- ❖ Etc.

This is basically what blue bin recycling for plastics is about for Vermonters!

***From amongst plastics #1 thru #7, only #1, 2, & 5 will be recycled, due to the availability of markets for those plastics. Additionally, #1 & #2 are banned from the landfill in Vermont!**
