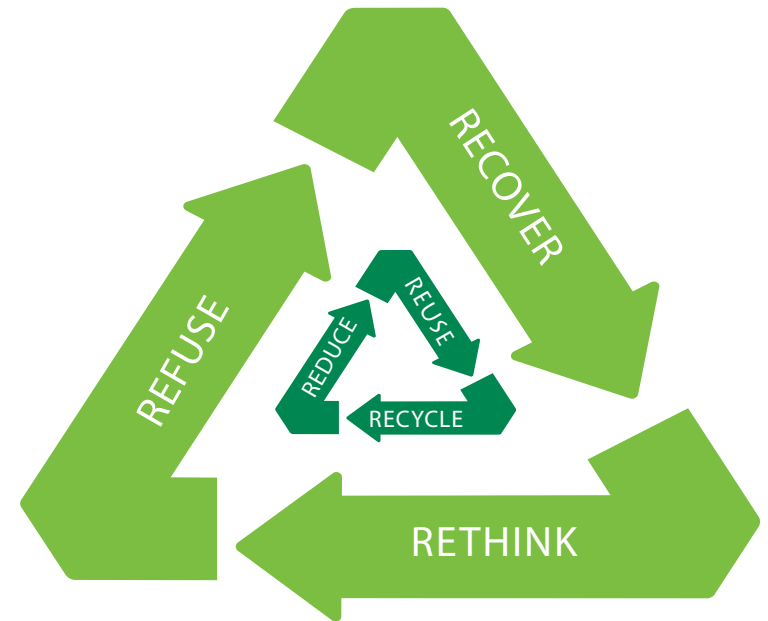

ARCC FACILITY FEE

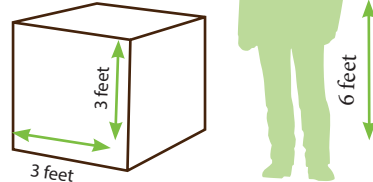

Any combination of the following items are accepted by the following fees by volume:

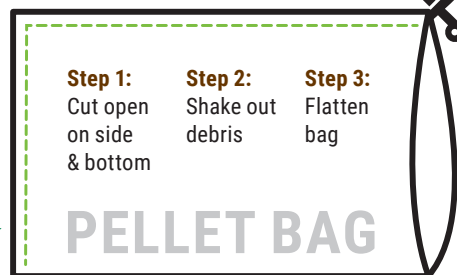
5 gallons or less - \$2.50
Up to 1/2 cubic yard - \$6
Per cubic yard - \$12

- Air freshener packaging (no aerosols)
- Baby food squeeze pouches
- Bags, hats, belts, gloves
- Batteries (automotive, lead acid)
- Beer bottle caps
- Brita filters & packaging
- CDs, DVDs, floppy disks
- Cell phone cases
- Cigarette waste (no cartons)
- Clothing (clean, odorless, dry)
- Cooking oil (used)
- Deodorant containers (empty)
- Documents for secure shredding
- Fire extinguishers
- Food storage containers
- Holiday lights
- Ink & toner cartridges
- Instrument strings
- Juice pouches (straws included)
- Linens/bedding
- Medical equipment
- Metal caps & lids
- Metal cookware
- Pens & markers (empty)
- Plastic film (clean, stretchy, not compostable or crinkly, no #5 or #7 plastic)

This is the size of a cubic yard.



- Scrap metal (under 4 feet)
- Shaving razors & razor blades
- Shoes (in pairs)
- Skis/boards/boots/poles
- Small metal items (screws, binder clips, silverware, etc.)
- Spray triggers and pumps
- Toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes, floss (empty)
- Vinyl records
- Wires, cables, & adapters



NO FEES - FREE FOR RESIDENTS!

The following items are covered under Vermont's Extended Producer Responsibility Programs:

- **Household Batteries** under 11 lbs.
- **TV's, computers, and computer peripherals** such as monitors, desktop printers and scanners. Fees may apply to some non-residential customers with more than seven devices.
- **Household paint, stain, and tile sealer** (no marine/automotive paint, solvents, or spray paint)
- **Fluorescent bulbs and tubes:** 10 or fewer tubes and unlimited CFLs are free; fees apply to more than 10 non-CFL tubes.
- **Mercury containing thermostats**

ITEMS WITH ADDITIONAL FEES

*Cash or check only

- **Audio Cassettes** \$0.25 each
- **Books** \$1 per 15 lbs
- **Corks** \$0.50/gal
- **Damaged or swollen lithium batteries** \$3 each
- **Electronics, up to 50 lbs** \$1-\$15 each
- **Floor model copier** \$75 each
- **Fluorescent light ballasts** \$3.00 each
- **Food scraps** \$2 for less than 5 gallons, \$3.50 per 5 gallon
- **Gas powered push-mowers** \$6.00 each (must be drained of all fluids)
- **Light bulbs** \$.40 - \$3.00 each (no neon)
- **Mercury Devices** \$2
- **Propane & helium tanks** \$1 for 1 lb, \$3 for 20 - 30 lb
- **Smoke detector** \$5
- **Tires** \$6 or \$7 on rim
- **Vape Pens** \$1 each (must be empty)
- **VHS Tapes** \$.33 each
