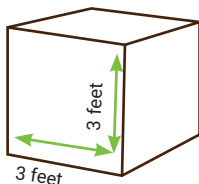

Cash or check only

Base fee \$6

- **Food scraps** \$2 for less than 5 gallons, \$3.50 per 5 gallon
- **Books** \$2 for 30 lb
- **Electronics, up to 50 lbs** \$1-\$15 each
- **Floor model copier** \$75
- **Propane & helium tanks** \$1 for 1 lb, \$3 for 20-30 lb
- **Smoke detector** \$5
- **Tires** \$6 or \$7 on rim
- **Fluorescent light ballasts** \$3.00 ea.
- **Light bulbs** most types, \$.40 - \$3.00 ea. (no neon)
- **VHS Tapes** \$.33 ea.
- **Gas powered push-mowers** \$6.00 ea. (Must be drained of all fluids)
- **Mercury Devices** \$2

Batteries, TVs, Computers, House Paint and Stain, CFLs, Fluorescent Bulbs and Mercury Thermostats

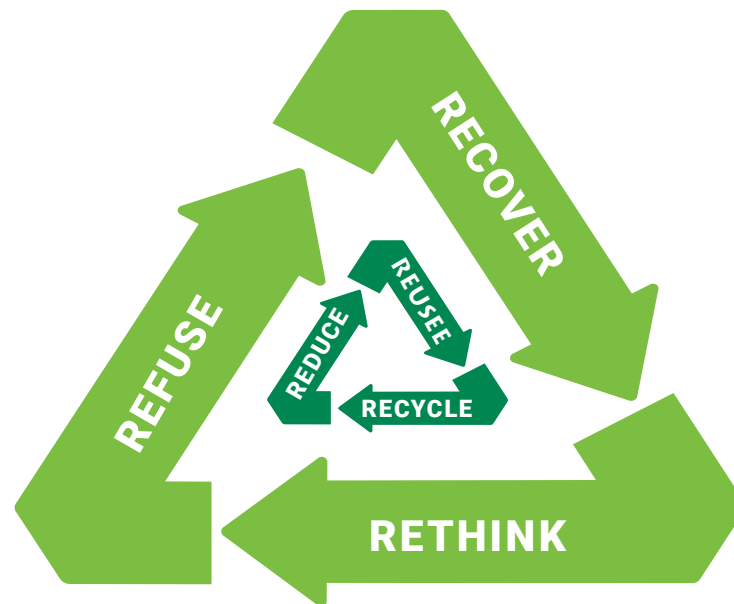

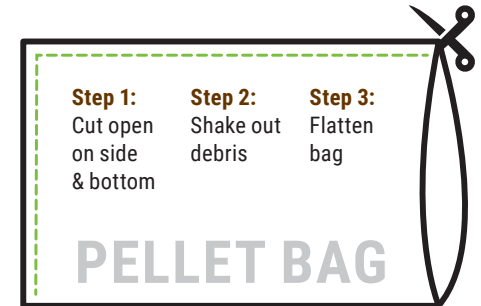

Plastic film including:

- Plastic packing materials (bubble wrap & air pillows)
- Cereal bags (unprinted only)
- Produce bags (not compostable)
- Bread bags (no paper, not crinkly)
- Dry cleaning bags
- Carry-out bags
- Case wrap
- Stretch film
- Newspaper bags
- Product overwrap (plastic wrap for toilet paper, beverage cases, etc)
- Ziplocs and food storage bags



SPORTS GEAR & CLOTHING

- Bike tires & tubes (no slime)*
- Clothing (clean, reusable)
- Shoes
- Skis/boards/boots/poles
